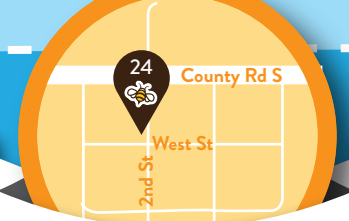

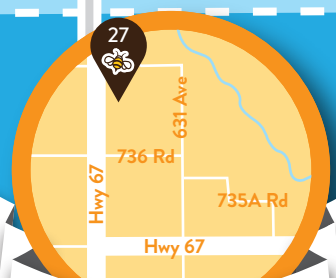

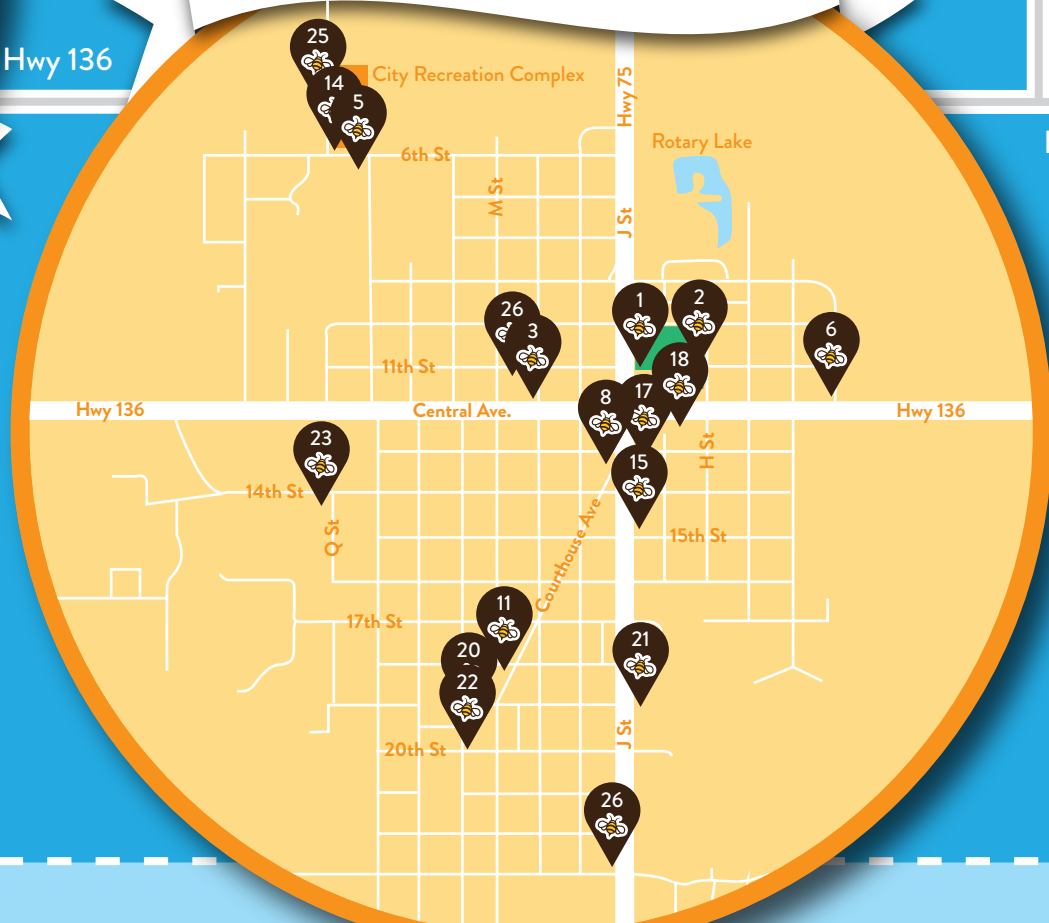

The Honeybees in the Heartland Project began as part of a participation requirement of the Nemaha County Leadership Class #6. Ideas were many, but the class ultimately decided on a county-wide public art project encompassing art, sculptures, beauty, history, culture, tourism, and community unity. As a sweet nod to our agricultural community, and as Nebraska’s state insect, the honeybee became the focus of the project.

Today, Honeybees in the Heartland features 27 unique and exquisitely painted sculptures throughout Nemaha County. Sculptures were sponsored by local businesses, organizations, and individuals—each choosing the design and landing place of their bee. Sculptures were painted by a variety of artists—many of whom are local residents or have close ties to the community. The result was a hive of whimsical honeybee sculptures, bringing joy and beauty to all as they buzz across the landscape.

In order to accomplish this massive project, support from the community was paramount, and the magnitude of the response far exceeded all expectations. Honeybees in the Heartland reminds us that unity and working together is imperative for the good of our hive and for the community we love.
